Washington Academy students visit Hartlepool Power Station



On Thursday 8th February a group of geographers attended a behind the scenes tour of Hartlepool's EDF power station, an often-restricted part of the world!

As part of this tour students were given a detailed discussion surrounding nuclear fusion and how electricity is made and informed of key job opportunities within the nuclear sector, from scientist jobs through to the powerplant cleaners. Then they were kitted up in safety equipment, including helmets, ear defenders, Hi-Vis Jackets and protective eye wear and embarked on an hour tour of the power station.

All the students who attended this trip were a fantastic representation of Washington Academy and were engaged with the tour guides at every point! We are looking forward to additional trips in the future to the Power Station with trips planned for November 2024!

Work experience week

We are very excited to launch work experience week with our year 10 students.

What is work experience week?

Work Experience is a period of time where students work for/shadow a company or organisation to gain experience of a particular type of work.

Work experience can:

- ⇒ Provide your child with an insight into the world of work.
- ⇒ Give your child practical experience with an employer and allow them to develop their workplace skills.
- ⇒ Help your child to get a better sense of their future career path.
- ⇒ Enable your child to build a relationship with a local employer and make a lasting impression.

Sourcing a placement

Students will be responsible for sourcing their own placement for this period. Please get in contact with friends and family to see if they can support your child for work experience week. Contact local businesses via phone or through their social media. If your child doesn't source a placement, they will be in school as normal for that week.

Your child will need to add all of the details of this placement to the Morrisby platform. They have been send an email link to their consilium email account to activate this process. Students will all need to complete the aspirations survey first when the log on,

Hot Water Bottles

It has come to our attention that a number of students are using hot water bottles to help ease cramps and pains. Unfortunately, the use of hot water bottles presents a significant health and safety risk in terms of risk of burns, heat related injuries and the potential for spillages of water.

Due to these risks we cannot allow hot water bottles to be used within the school building.

If your child wishes to use a microwaveable heat pack or adhesive heat pads these may be used but would need to be given to the main reception to be held until needed. Students will not be able to microwave heat pads themselves.

Medication

Students who require medication, prescribed or otherwise, must have a medication care plan in place. This can only be done by having a meeting with the Academy representative in terms of Administering Medication to a Child.

This meeting should be conducted in person by a parent or carer who will bring the medication in with them to the meeting. Unless specifically authorised on their medication care plan, students are not to bring or carry any medication in school.

All medication to be administered is to be held securely in the first aid room and administered by a suitably trained member of staff. Please contact our main reception to arrange a medication care plan.

Importance of Attendance at Washington Academy

Your child should be in school every day. There is a clear connection between exam grades and attendance, and we want to work with you to ensure our pupils reach their full potential. Every day really does count.

How you can help:

- Contact school daily to report an absence.
- If your child has a medical appointment, please ensure they don't have the whole day off and come into school before and after where possible.
- Communicate with the school if there are any issues at home we can support you with or that may be affecting attendance.
- Bring in medical evidence e.g. a prescription, appointment card, hospital letter. Whether the absence is authorised is dependent on their attendance record and the discretion of the Attendance Team.
- Only take your child on holiday during the allocated school breaks (which is 13 weeks per year) Fines may be issued if holidays are taken during school time.






Year 11 Exams

Please see below a copy of the timetable and we would like to ask that you encourage your Year 11 child to attend so they can take advantage of this extra support.








